

UWI LOK JACK GLOBAL SCHOOL OF BUSINESS HOSTS NATIONAL BUSINESS SIMULATION COMPETITION WITH 17 SECONDARY SCHOOLS

The 3-month competition allows secondary schools across Trinidad and Tobago to learn the art of business war through an online simulation game.

The five (5) member team from each school, were provided with a business scenario and have to make weekly business decisions based on the context and competitor actions in their assigned universe.

The objective of the simulation competition is to assist students in applying their business knowledge, which in turn would help them to better understand the concepts being taught as part of the CXC Syllabus.

Five (5) boys from St. Anthony's College entered the business simulation competition. The competition is now at the halfway point where sixteen (16) teams have been knocked out and only six (6) teams remain. St. Anthony's College is among the 6 remaining teams. The other teams are Naparima Boys College, St. James Secondary, Parvati Girls Hindu College, ASJA Girls San Fernando and Swaha Hindu College.

The students from the top three teams will win partial scholarships for the Bachelor of International Business at the Arthur Lok Jack Global School of Business and the opportunity to interact with alumni for career guidance.
